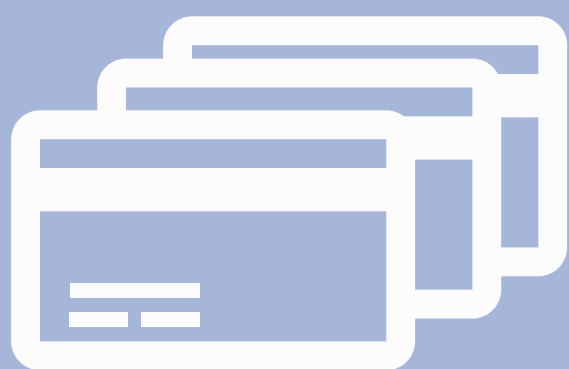

 DISTRIBUTED.**

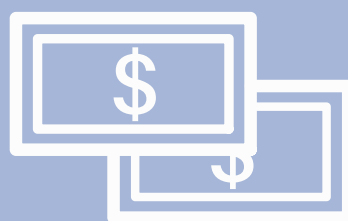


These gift cards

 food distribution events.

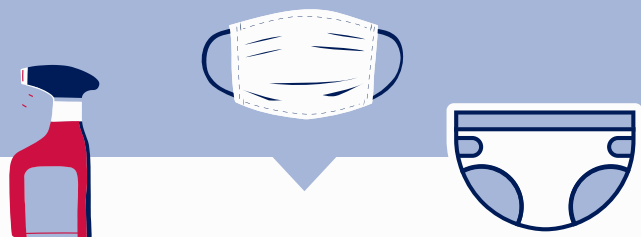
**MORE THAN 1,000
