The Catholic Charities Federation

Cardinal Ritter Senior Services provides a continuum of care to senior adults including housing, residential, healthcare, volunteer opportunities, and supportive social services.

Good Shepherd Children & Family Services connects children with families and keeps families connected by providing the highest quality care for young moms and their babies in the maternity shelter; parents facing a crisis pregnancy; youth in foster care and treatment foster care; and prospective parents, birth moms and babies needing adoption services.

Marygrove has been providing a safe, hope-filled, haven for children and families impacted by abuse, neglect, and other forms of trauma for 170 years. Through a broad range of residential and behavior health programs, Marygrove focuses on creating a promising future for youth from birth to 21 years of age.

Queen of Peace Center provides family-centered behavioral healthcare to women with substance use disorders, their children, and their families.

Saint Louis Counseling provides professional emotional/mental-health counseling for people of all ages and backgrounds at eight office locations; partners with Employee Assistance Programs; serves local schools; conducts trainings; and provides webinars & community outreach.

Saint Martha's Hall is an emergency, confidential shelter care program for abused women and their children.

St. Francis Community Services walks with our vulnerable neighbors to create opportunities, build resiliency, and advocate for justice.

St. Patrick Center provides opportunities for self-sufficiency and dignity to people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Individuals and families build permanent, positive change in their lives through safe and affordable housing, sound mental and physical health, and employment and financial stability.

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
