President's Message

“Were not our hearts burning within us?” - Luke 24:32

My dear sisters and brothers,

Peace! As I begin this new ministry in the leadership of Catholic Charities of St. Louis, I am grateful for the many heartfelt moments of welcome. From the time of my announcement to now, the hospitality of the Catholic Charities community has been evident. I am most grateful to the senior leadership team at Catholic Charities of St. Louis and our agency leaders for their kind welcome. I am also thankful to the ministry of Theresa Ruzicka for her kindness and generosity during this time of transition. Thank you all.

In this issue, you will see great examples of how we continue to meet the needs of our dear neighbors. As we journey together with all those who minister at Catholic Charities, our agencies, our generous benefactors and, most importantly, the people who entrust themselves to our care, the key will be listening and looking for moments of encounter. For me, the context is from the post-resurrection story of the Road to Emmaus.

Recall the disciples' story on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-32). As they walked, Jesus approached them and told them stories of the events. They were attentive to their excitement. “Were not our hearts burning within us?” was their question. Initially, they did not know it was Jesus who walked with them. When they finally noticed him in the breaking of the bread, he was gone. Our walk of discipleship is much like the disciples in Scripture: we need to attend to when our hearts are burning within us—where we see glimpses of God in our day and in what we do. Those glimpses help transform us to grow closer to God and others. Those glimpses help us to change society for the common good.

I continue to return to this story, and there are many ways this story continues to evoke a response in me. One of the ways it speaks to me today is the journey itself and that Jesus comes alongside them to connect the dots for them on what had just happened. The disciples listened and encountered Jesus. So, an initial part of this journey, with the Church, and ultimately with Jesus is a time of deep listening.

Like Pope Francis, who has called the Church to a greater level of synodality, Archbishop Rozanski also calls us to a listening process as part of All Things New and the Synod on Synodality. While my listening journey has already begun, starting later this month, I will start a formal process of listening. Like the call from Pope Francis and Archbishop Rozanski, I, too, will start listening in prayer to unify the mission and identity, looking for new and innovative ways to serve and be an intentional steward to strengthen Catholic Charities as a ministry of the Church. I invite you to join me in this Emmaus journey. May we find our “hearts burning within us” and find ourselves and our communities transformed by our encounter with Jesus, especially in being evangelized by people who are most vulnerable and marginalized in our communities. Together with the women and men in our ministries, I look forward to journeying with you. Know of my continued gratitude and prayers.

Sam Goodwin is Featured Speaker at the Lally Lecture

On April 22, Sam Goodwin, a Catholic speaker, advocate and entrepreneur, spoke at the 2022 Lally Lecture. The Lally Lecture is named in honor of Catholic Charities of St. Louis Past President John M. Lally, whose years of leadership were marked by his love of Christ and His Church.

Sam was chosen to speak at this lecture because his story resonates so clearly with our work at Catholic Charities. While on a quest to visit every country in the world, and with only 13 to go, Sam decided to visit Syria. Things did not go as planned, and Sam was held captive in an underground prison in Syria for 62 days.

At Catholic Charities, we help those who find themselves on the margins of society, cast away to a life in darkness without hope. Through our work, which is anchored in Christ's compassion and care, we enter into the lives of those who come to us in

need, and help them to find freedom from the ties that bind them. In Sam's circumstances, he found himself confined in the darkest of places, with little hope. Through his stalwart faith and the help of others, Sam was able to survive and to find his freedom.

Sam told attendees about his incessant prayer and dialogue with God, as he sat in solitary confinement for the first 23 days. Through persistent prayer, he said, he received an interior movement from the Holy Spirit to pray for *forgiveness* for his captors! He said that forgiveness is a choice, not an emotion, and that it must be intentional. Sam also mentioned that he

repeatedly prayed the Rosary on his fingers, only to discover that his teacher who taught him how to pray the Rosary was in the audience!

Sam was eventually freed in a manner that was beyond anyone's imagination. He reflected that despite circumstances that seemed insurmountable, that with faith, God will work things out in His own way and in His own time. We were all grateful to Sam for sharing his story, and for drawing the parallels to our work that focuses on being the Face of Christ to those in need.

Jackie has generously and graciously shared her time, talents, and treasures for almost 30 years! Jackie first became involved in 1993 when she was invited to attend a meeting during her lunch hour, and she has been involved ever since. Jackie has served on the board of directors and is always a champion for the senior adults served by CRSS.



Young ladies from Incarnate Word Academy showered kindness on new and expectant mothers and their babies at St. Philippine Maternity Home, a **Queen of Peace Center** service site. The high school received a grant through Incarnate Word Foundation to purchase car seats, baby bathtubs, baby clothes, burp cloths, pacifiers, maternity clothing, and much more. This level of care and support from youth in our community truly has an everlasting positive impact on women served by Queen of Peace Center.



Good Shepherd is proud to recognize people who work with their agency to provide safe homes for children in foster care. Mama Barb is a treatment foster care parent. Barb says her reward is seeing children prosper. "I get to see them go from being angry and hurt and rejected to a kid that is happy, whole, and loving life. We're no longer talking about hurting ourselves—we're talking about life and our future and college and going into the military. They understand that life isn't as bad as they thought it would be. They learn that they aren't as bad as they were told." It is our honor to walk alongside Barb and the many families Good Shepherd serves through foster care!





During the month of May, **Saint Martha's Hall** had the pleasure of welcoming five high school volunteers. Mallory, Grace (Visitation Academy), Luc, Slava, and Daniel (Vianney High School) who completed their Junior service hours by helping sort donations, gardening, attending court, and learning more about what women and children who seek services at Saint Martha's Hall go through to break the cycle of domestic violence in their lives. We are grateful to these volunteers for the open hearts, joyful spirits, and hard work they brought to their service. We wish them well as they prepare for their senior year of high school.



Recently **St. Patrick Center's** Hospital to Healthy Housing program was honored at the FOCUS St. Louis What's Right with the Region Awards for promoting community health and well-being. The Hospital to Healthy Housing program supports emergency department utilizers who are experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity by working with emergency department social workers to coordinate discharge planning, and assist with bridging a referral to a housing provider, shelter, or housing intervention. The program works directly with Behavioral Health Network, Barnes Jewish Hospital, and SSM/SLU Hospital.



When the U.S. Surgeon General issued his Protecting Youth Mental Health Advisory this past December, **Saint Louis Counseling** therapists were already seeing a concerning decline in the mental well-being of children and teens. This Catholic Charities agency knew that a collective effort of support would be essential. The call to "Help Youth Thrive"—Saint Louis Counseling's first-ever Day of Giving May 3-4—was met with a resounding response to surpass the goal. Thanks to the generosity of so many, the agency will be able to place three therapists in its School Partnership Program schools this fall, one day a week each, providing mental-health services to hundreds more children.
